IMPORTANT NOTES

Admission to BSW Ist Sem, and MSW, Ist Sem courses will be given on the basis of merit in the qualifying examination and aptitude for Social Work which will be assessed through a personal interview. The application form must be filed in the candidate own handwriting and due care should be taken to ensure that it is complete in all respects. Incomplete application forms are liable to be rejected. If a candidate furnishes false information, his/her admission may be cancelled at any stage and fee already paid will not be refunded. The applicants must make sure that they fulfill the eligibility criteria as laid down by the university.

The last date for admission would be as per the university declaration, subject to the availability of seats. The cost of prospectus, application form and the admission fees are not refundable.

The original certificates should not be attached to the application form but they must be produced at the time of the admission for verification only attested photocopies should be annexed to the application form.

The parents and guardians are requested to make it convenient to call on the Principal occasionally or on phone to know the progress of the ward with regard to attendance performance and general conduct/their co-operation would be invaluable for strengthening the college. Those who apply for transfer Certificate have to pay the full annual fee.

RULE AND REGULATIONS :-

1. The college maintains strict discipline and expects rules to be followed by every student in the college campus and outside. Students must obey the instructions of the principal. Students found violating the rules of the college administration or behaving in an indisciplined manner will have their names removed from the college rolls. It will be presumed on admission that the students concerned and their parents or guardians have read and concurred with these rules
2. Students are expected to be very regular in attending classes field {Practicum} work and research conferences and other curricular activities such as the skill laboratory sessions
3. Students must acquaint themselves with the attendance rules of the Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University and should follow them strictly.
4. Students are expected to make adequate use of the library not only during the time slots for library work mentioned in the Time Table but also at other times during the working hours of the library.
5. For further details about the syllabus the students must see the latest prospectus of the Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University.
6. The college endeavors to maintain high standards in the field of Social Work Education. The students must strive continuously in this direction and must work sincerely. Various co-curricular activities are conducted at the college and the college would welcome active participation of the students in these activities

7. Identity Card: It is essential for every college students to bear the Identity Card with him/her while in the college premises so that he/she is able to produce it on being asked to.

8. Students should make careful use of college books, room furniture, fans, library and college property, in general. The cost of any damage done would be recoverable from the students either individually or collectively as the case may be.

9. Students are prohibited from forming associations /organizations and from holding functions in this college without the prior permission of the Principal. Students are prohibited from organizing, welcome, farewell and other such functions, outside college premises. Violation of rules will merit severe disciplinary action. The Principal's decision in all matter of admission, administrations and enforcement of discipline and general rules and other important instruction mentioned in this prospectus shall be final and binding on all.

10. According to Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act. No. 33, 15th May 1999. "RAGGING" is strictly prohibited " Ragging " means a display of disorderly conduct, this doing of any act which causes or fear or shame or embarrassment in a student in any educational institution and includes. :-

A. Teasing, abusing, the altering, or playing practical jokes on or causing hurt to any student;

B. Prohibition of ragging:- Ragging within or outside of any educational institution is prohibited.

C. Penalty for ragging :- Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in abets or propagates ragging within or outside any educational institution shall on conviction, be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees.

D. Dismissal of students:- Any student convicted of an offence under section 4 shall be dismissed from the educational Institution and such a student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of five years from the date of order of such dismissal.

E. Suspension of Students :- If the student is found guilty in such cases his/her admission shall be terminated from the institution Smoking and / or Gutkha chewing are strictly prohibited. Offenders shall be liable to face legal action.
